









WHAT IS ROMSEY COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLANNING GROUP?

'A voluntary group comprising elected members, community and voluntary groups, local emergency responders, Local Authorities and local businesses and residents that is working in partnership to develop, maintain and implement where required - a Community Emergency Plan.'

WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE GROUP?

To develop and enhance the community resilience of Romsey, before, during and after any emergency.'

WHAT IS COMMUNITY RESILIENCE?

'Communities and individuals harnessing local resources and expertise to help themselves in an emergency, in a way that complements the emergency services.'

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLAN?

'A plan that enhances 'Community Resilience' by enabling the community to respond to an emergency in an organised, controlled and safe way.'




WHY DO WE NEED A COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLAN?

'When emergencies happen, emergency response organisations always have to prioritise those in greatest need – especially where life is in danger. Consequently, when a community is affected by an emergency, but life is not in immediate danger – the community will have to look after themselves until such time that any necessary external assistance can be provided.'

By becoming more resilient, the broad Romsey community can complement the work of our local emergency responders and reduce the impact of an emergency on the community.

WHAT IS THE SCOPE OF THE ROMSEY COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLAN?

The whole Romsey community: Romsey Town and Romsey Extra.

IN RESPONDING TO AN EMERGENCY

The support of the Community Emergency Planning Group may be required:

BEFORE the arrival of the Emergency Services and Local Authorities - especially if it is a widespread emergency.

Co-ordinating and supporting the initial response.

DURING the response by the Emergency Services and Local Authorities.

Providing Support as requested/directed.

AFTER the Emergency Services and Local Authorities have left.

Supporting and promoting the recovery and return to business as usual (normality).

WHAT IS THE PROCESS OF DEVELOPING THE PLAN?

Establish a Community Emergency Planning Group	Done
Identify potential risks facing the Romsey community	Done
Consider what help and support is required	Done
Organise community drop-in event to raise awareness	Done
Presentations at Romsey Forum, Romsey Future, Neighbourhood Watch meetings	Done
Assess the existing community skills and resources	In hand
Identify key locations for use in an emergency	In hand
Identify those likely to be affected and their needs	In hand
Consider who may be vulnerable in an emergency	In hand
Formulate 'All hazards' Emergency plans	In hand

WHAT HAPPENS IN AN EMERGENCY?

ANTICIPATED EVENT

- Plan response with Emergency Services/Local Authorities.
- Establish Community Emergency Planning Group Response Team and community resources/support.
- Monitor the situation and action the plan, if necessary.
- Manage the community response in support of the Emergency Services/Local Authority.

SPONTANEOUS EVENT

- · Community Emergency Planning Team alerted.
- Liaise with Emergency Services/Local Authorities.
- Action relevant plan.
- Determine community response/support/resources required in the circumstances.
- Call on resources/support to manage the response.
- Maintain effective communications throughout.

STAND DOWN

 Co-ordinate the stand down and support the community recovery/return to normality
