TOWN CENTRE MANAGER'S REPORT

s the summer comes to an end and we reflect on the 2016 Town Centre events I believe the various organisers can be proud of what they put on. The most recent event the Romsey Food Festival was a cornucopia of stalls enabling visitors to taste food styles from around the world. Hard to believe this event is organised by a very small group of local business managers with any profits being allocated to local community groups.

Back in July we saw record crowds at the ever popular "Beggars Fair", another event organised by volunteers for the residents and visitors alike. This year twenty four venues offered over eighty acts. It was good to have the Library, Comrades Club and Cromwell Arms join in the fun this year. For those that attended the Romsey Show in September you may have noticed that "Beggars Fair" ran one of the music sites on the show ground, opening up another local venue for our talented musicians, part of bringing town and country even closer.

These events are well run by volunteers but with no admission charges possible to cover costs they are heavily dependent on advertisers and sponsors for expenses such as insurance and marketing. If you own or work for a local Romsey business, please consider if you could help in some way. I can arrange sponsorship packages from £500 that offer the opportunity to promote your business to audiences exceeding 6,000

people many from areas outside of the immediate town. My contact details are below.

We have added the dates on page 4 for all our regular Romsey Christmas events which will be enjoyed under our Christmas lights that have all been refurbished for the new season. This is another part of the Romsey year that is dependent on volunteers, this time from the scouts and local fire station, who erect and monitor the lights under the guidance of professional electricians.

We are actively working on next years "Romsey Festival" that will take place in the first two weeks of July 2017 - more detail in a future newsletter and on www.romseyfestival.org.Watch out for a new "Arts in Romsey 2017" leaflet to be published later this year and delivered to every Romsey address thanks to significant sponsorship from David Wilson Homes. The provisional programme for the Festival is looking really good with locations stretching into the surrounding villages and covering a wide genre of art based activity.

ROMSEY EVENTS

Sunday 13th November

REMEMBRANCE DAY PARADE

There are some changes to the arrangements for Remembrance Sunday. A church service involving representatives from local groups and the military will commence at 9.30 in The Abbey. The congregation will proceed to the Memorial Park to assemble at 10.50 for the Act of Remembrance. This will be livestreamed onto screens in The Abbey for those that are unable to walk to the park. *Following the Act of Remembrance there will be a March Past the Civic Party in the Market Place at approximately 11.30.*

Saturday 26th November ROMSEY CHRISTMAS LIGHT SWITCH ON

We will gather in the Market Place for the light switch on at 6.30pm, this will be followed by the Winter Carnival Parade. An evening we hope will be enjoyed by residents and visitors alike.

There will be a number of road closures for this event, including the Market Place that will restrict access to Abbey Water for a while. We would encourage as many people as possible to walk into this event as the car parks are traditionally very busy.

Saturday 3rd December

SMALL BUSINESS SATURDAY

This is a national event celebrating and promoting small businesses, including those that do not normally have a presence on the High Street. The Romsey Chamber are organising an all-day event in the Town Hall showcasing some excellent local businesses. The event is supported by Test Valley Borough Council and Romsey Town Council.

Friday 9th December LATE NIGHT SHOPPING AND LANTERN PARADE

A highlight for many at Christmas, Romsey shops will open into the evening offering an extra special seasonal welcome to customers. The Community Lantern Parade will assemble at The Abbey and move off at approximately 5.45pm passing through the Market Place, down Bell Street, through Dukes Mill around the Bus Station and down Sterling Walk and return to The Abbey via The Hundred and Market Place.

We hear Santa is expected to arrive in the town that evening, at approximately 6.30pm. We have the emergency services standing by in case he makes his usual navigational error and lands on a roof. Santa will then adjourn to Bradbeers to enable him to meet our younger residents. Shops will remain open to approximately 8pm or later if crowds remain.

A number of town centre roads will be closed for this event please look for diversion signs

Sunday 18th December CHRISTMAS HAMPSHIRE FARMERS MARKET

This additional Farmers Market will be held on its normal site, Alma Road car park and open from 10am to 2pm with a focus on Christmas items. This event will involve suspension of parking at the Waitrose end of the TVBC car park.

Monday 19th December

CAROLS IN ROMSEY MARKET PLACE

A fantastic evening of carols and live music with people gathering in the Market Place from 6.30pm. This event is organised by Romsey Rotary and is much enjoyed by the many hundreds that gather in the square. *This event involves closure of the Market Place and The Hundred to vehicles*.

Defence of the Realm Romsey in World War II

n the early part of the Second World War, the danger of invasion by the Germans and their allies, was great. In particular London had to be protected.

Amongst the precautions taken by the Government was the provision of 'Stop' Lines where invaders would be held up. One of these was along the River Test. The most conspicuous reminders of these defences are the Pill Boxes, some of which still exist but we have none on this part of the Test.

The most substantial of our surviving barriers is the row of Dragons' teeth on the town side of Greatbridge, next to the footpath, although it is overgrown with ivy. They would have made tank movement difficult, especially if the bridge had been mined.

There is a slit trench on Broadlands land south of the By-Pass in the area that has recently been tidied up and fenced in. Whether this was for a defensive position, or whether it was to enable cover for snipers, I do not know.

A sniper was also posted in a large tree by the

Tadburn, near Knatchbull Close. The metal bar on which a gun could be rested is still there, as is the insulator through which his telephone was connected. Machine gunners took up position at the southern end of the Memorial Park every night, roughly where the playground is now. Until railings were taken away for the war effort, the gunners had to climb over them to get to their gun.

Amongst the defensive arrangements, sources of water were identified which could be used for firefighting. These were marked with the letters SWS which stood for Static Water Supply. They were painted in large letters on nearby walls, and some of the paint still survives.

Most if not all of the bomb shelters have gone. There were some provided by the Council and others were provided by householders for their own use. For example, there used to be one on the grass opposite the Plaza roundabout, and another in a back garden behind Station Road and the basement of the Town Hall provided another.
