Autumn and Winter are often seen as the cold and darker months and the temptation is to stay in the warm. However, Romsey has some fantastic events in front of us and a chance for all of us to venture out and celebrate our Town and surrounding villages.

Remembrance and Armistice Day remembered by the whole community and respectfully we all give our thanks to those who have given their lives for us. This year Romsey has Armistice Day on Saturday 11th and will have the Fort Cumberland Guard Reenactment team with their cannon display in the park from 10.30am with the canon being fired at 11.00. On Remembrance Day the parade will commence from Love Lane at 9am through the town and to Romsey Abbey for the Service of Remembrance commencing at 9.25am. Following the service, all will make their way to the Romsey War Memorial Park where a service will be conducted. Michelmersh Silver Band, Romsey Old Cadet Buglers and the Romsey Abbey Choirs will be in attendance. There will be a fly pass by an Apache from Middle Wallop just before the 2-minute silence at 11am.

Our historic market town will be transformed in November ready for the Annual Christmas Lights Switch on and the Romsey and District Chamber of Commerce and Industry will be organising the illuminated trees above the shops and businesses. We all look forward to seeing the town lit up in full glory with the Christmas tree centre piece of the Town alighting Market Place.

Christmas will officially start in Romsey on Saturday 25th November from 5pm with the 'Big Light Switch On' and 'Winter Carnival and

Lantern Parade'. This year the Carnival route will be starting from Abbey Walk and meander through the Market Place, down the Hundred and past the Crosfield Hall bringing it back up Bell Street and returning to the Abbey. This night is always a busy time with many people venturing out, please space yourselves out along the Carnival route. To keep everyone safe please listen to instructions from our marshals and where possible leave any pets at home.

It's the traditional Saving Santa night on Friday 8th December. This year Romsey & District Chamber of Commerce and Industry brings you an evening of family entertainment starting from 4pm in Romsey Town Centre. Come and join in the fun and be a reindeer hunter in the new Romsey Reindeer trail. Follow the map to find all the missing reindeers in time to save Santa at 6.45pm with Hampshire Fire and Rescue.

There is no better way to rouse the Christmas spirit than with a good old sing-along in Romsey Market Place. Romsey Carols in the Market Place will take place on Monday 19th December so come wrapped up in need of a mulled wine or two!

We are lucky to have a thriving Town Centre with many independent retailers, eateries, and a mix of markets throughout the week so please come and support your local traders in the lead up to Christmas, they need your custom to thrive, think of it as an investment in your community.

Romsey Abbey, the largest parish church in Hampshire, also have some fantastic events scheduled in the lead up to and over Christmas. The Christmas Fair on Saturday 25th November is a must and always a fabulous event. Romsey Methodist Church are bringing back their successful Christmas Tree Festival this year, on Friday 8th and Saturday 9th December. Watch out for other seasonal events in our other churches as they celebrate this very special time. I would like to extend our heartfelt thanks and

gratitude to all the wonderful volunteers and community organisations who give so much time and effort to supporting the town. We have some fantastic events over the year which are all organised and run by our community. This means hours spent in the planning, not to mention those on the night who help keep everyone safe by marshalling the roads and crowds and providing the entertainment.

To help showcase these amazing charities and organisations, we will be having our second Volunteer Fair on Sunday 21st January 2024

at Romsey Town Hall. We have opportunities such as surveying wildlife and helping to protect internally important habitats, help lead healthy walks, help organise and contribute at music and cultural festivals, explore and research local history, and help those who need it in our local community. There really is something for all ages, skills, and passions. There is no need to book, it is a free event, just turn up between 10.30am and 3pm and browse the stalls to find your opportunity to have fun and give something back.

Wilder Romsey

Out of a Romsey Future workstream that was looking at the natural environment – via a launch held at the Plaza Theatre involving Cllrs Neil Gwynne and Janet Burnage – came the Wilder Romsey initiative. From the very beginning it has always been closely linked with Test Valley Borough Council's 'green spaces' team, and has run projects including (to date):

- photography competition (a prize-winning example from Graham Hills below!)
- regular maintenance of the canal bankside
- planting of a community orchard on Greater Woodley estate
- wildflower 'corners' on the Greater Woodley estate
- free provision of bird box kits, and tree saplings, to residents
- maintenance of tree saplings and cutting back of invasive saplings on Abbotswood estate and reserve

And now ... Romsey Town Council have taken on administration of the main route by which volunteers for Wilder Romsey projects get to hear about them and get involved in them. This is via a Google group that allows all those who have signed up to Wilder Romsey to be sent information about what is happening next—and volunteer to be part of whichever activity they want to—without their email address being shared. To mark this change, a relaunch of Wilder Romsey will take place later in the year.

Romsey Forum

A short Introduction, the what and why of the Forum



The first meeting of Romsey Forum was chaired by Cllr Mark Cooper on 22nd June 1994.

The Forum is an open debating chamber where the issues of the day affecting Romsey can be fully aired and where the general public and town organisations can, through the Forum Chairman, question officers of the County Council and Borough Council.

The Forum decides its own structure - people who thrive on rules and structures may find this concept difficult but there is no constitution or rule book. Members are those residents of Romsey Town Council four wards that attend any meetings.

Names and e-mail addresses registered on the Forum attendance forms are retained by the Forum secretaries to enable details of future meetings, minutes, and other documents of interest to be circulated. Members can email romseyforum@gmail.com if they wish to be removed from the circulation.



Minutes of previous meetings can be found on the Forum page on the Town Council website. The Forum usually meets four times a year in March, June, September, and November in the Court Room of Romsey Town Hall.

All local town, parish, borough, and county Councillors are on the circulation list, but they are encouraged to listen rather than lead in the context of the Forum although cross examinations and up-to-date information are appreciated.

So, with no constitution and no rulebook the Forum's success relies on the ability of the Chairman and Secretary to find good topics and to charm Council officers into attending and submitting themselves to scrutiny.

Note: If you are coming along to watch, we please ask that you keep the parade route roads clear for its safe progress through the town.


Note: A number of town centre roads will be closed for some of these events, please look for diversion signs.

Your local councillors are not a substitute for this reporting but will of course help if they can, especially with continuing problems. Contact details for your Councillor can be found within this newsletter, they are also on the Romsey Town Council website. Alternatively you can contact the Town Hall between 09:00 and 15:00 Monday to Friday, by phone **01794 512837** or in person.

For serious offences in progress or where there is danger of harm use **999**.

Please report all problems using the contacts below:

Hampshire County Council (HCC)

For potholes, pavements, flooding, streetlights etc. you can 'Report a Problem' at www.hants.gov.uk/transport/roadmaintenance/roadproblems

For urgent reports where there is immediate danger to the public call **0300 555 1388** during office hours or **101** at other times.

Test Valley Borough Council (TVBC)
